The transmission sends every few minutes and has been turned on in a number of group vehicles and field vehicles as well as a number of fire appliances throughout the state. ## **Updated Map Book Proposal**

Most of our Tasmania Fire Service (TFS) personnel would have had some experience with the map books currently supplied with our vehicles.

The first edition of the Tasmanian Map Book was published in 2007. The publication was a new concept primarily designed to satisfy the needs of the Tasmania Fire Service (TFS). As there were over 400 maps required to cover the State the publication became three map books covering the three TFS regions. The publication has proved to be an essential reference for TFS and other Emergency Services despite some of its shortcomings (i.e. over emphasis of certain features to the detriment of essential elements).

The publication is now over seven years old and uses topographic data that in some cases is 20 years old. Spatial analysis reveals that there has been considerable change to roads, buildings and dams in this intervening period.

TASMAP is proposing a number of changes to mapping products in Tasmania, including the abolition of the "Tassie Towns" street atlas, 1:100,000 and 1:25,000 map series. A new 1:50,000 topographic map series will be produced as a replacement.

In line with these changes there is an opportunity to update our current Map Books. Please provide your thoughts on whether we should replace the current out dated map book or consider other options, including electronic, to District Staff.

## **Message from Regional Chief South – Jeremy Smith**

Planning has commenced for the upcoming fire season with a number of activities being undertaken in preparation.



These included:

- The allocation of the latest heavy tanker build and subsequent flow on
- Pre fire season briefing content
- Identification and accreditation of level III incident controllers
- State-wide Exercise objectives and locations
- Fireline leadership courses
- Strategic fuel reduction planning

It is now the middle of winter but it won't be long until we are again in the bushfire season.

Could all Members please check their PPC to ensure it is clean and serviceable and if it needs replacing please contact your District staff.

### **Clothing Update**

The PPC Committee has been working for some time now on moving to a new structural ensemble. New Structural PPC has been rolled out in the North West (Burnie and Devonport) as this happens the PPC will be fitted to personnel by the manufacturer to ensure appropriate sizing and protection. The first 670 sets will arrive by mid this year and will be distributed to brigades with the priority going to those brigades with the most amount of structure fires being contained to room of origin. These brigades will also have to have correct storage built for the new structure PPC so that it can be hung up correctly and not stored in an engine bay. The new PPC also will need to be correctly laundered and the process for this is still being decided.
